How to Vote. The voter at election time in the polls in November with a pretty fair understanding of his duty and what will be required of him under the new law, should carefully remember the following important features...

1. Number in room.—Only ten voters are allowed in the voting room at once, outside the enclosed space, and only four voters in excess of the number of compartments are allowed outside the enclosed space at once...

2. Giving name, etc.—Voters must first go to the officers in charge of the ballots and state name and address. The right to vote must be proved to the voter allowing to pass the guard rail before he can receive a ballot...

3. Preparing ballots.—Voters must prepare their ballots forthwith and in the compartments. Each ballot must be marked with a cross (X) in a square at the right of a party name indicates a vote for all the candidates of that party.

4. Help in preparing ballots.—Voters may be helped to do so by any person in the room, but only in case of actual disability, which must be explicitly declared to the Judge. Section 27.

5. A voter who recovers such help without being actually unable to prepare his ballot will be liable to indictment for unlawfully showing his ballot. Section 27.

6. Challenges should be made before a voter receives his ballot, if possible, but may be made at any time before he casts it.
