

THE CZAR MARRIED.

HE WEDS PRINCESS ALIX AT THE WINTER PALACE.

Imposing Ceremonies Attended by Royal Personages—He Issues a Proclamation Remitting Certain Debts and Granting Amnesty to Some Offenders.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 27.—The czar, in honor of his marriage to Princess Alix, has issued a manifesto remitting certain of the crown debts, including the repayment of the grants made to the peasants on account of famines. He also wholly remits arrears of taxes and fines and mitigates or shortens sentences of imprisonment, police supervision and deportation at local levels.

The imperial manifesto would occupy a page of an English newspaper, scarcely anything to be commended. It is a comprehensive document breathing benevolence in every line. It grants the greatest amnesty accorded, for half a century, except the liberation of the serfs.

Thousands of troops and spectators lined the way by which the bride and groom proceeded to the winter palace. The bride's train was worn by five officials, two walking on either side, while the groom carried the bride on his shoulders. The czar wore the uniform of the famous red Hussars of the guard, with a doorman suspended from the right shoulder.

In the center of the chapel of the winter palace stood a holy table, on which had been placed the altar and cross. Between the table and the altar were multi-branched candelabra with lighted tapers. Behind the table, facing the altar, stood the priest, the officiating priest, the officiating priest, the officiating priest.

The ceremony was concluded a few minutes before 2 o'clock. The czar and his bride then proceeded to the cathedral to greet and thank her. She embraced her son and his wife, after which they were embraced and kissed by the King, the queen and their relatives. Everybody was much moved, and the bride was in tears. The czar was very pale and was visibly affected.
