Cadetship at West Point.
The much coveted opportunity of being a cadet at West Point military academy, which resulted in the favor of Uncle Sam, will be open to some one from this congressional district soon, a vacancy occurring in May of next year, and notice of competitive examination has been given by Congressman Hicks, on whom it is incumbent to nominate candidates for the place. The advantages offered are invaluable to a young man of military instinct and desires, but the time elapsing between now and the examination seems very brief for the necessary preparations. The notice is as follows:

WEST POINT CADETSHIP.
The secretary of war having notified me that this congressional district will have a vacancy at the military academy after May, 1896, and requesting me to nominate to him two persons—one as principal and the other as alternate—to fill said vacancy on or before the 1st of July next, I will, therefore, in accordance with the custom established by my honored predecessors, hold a competitive examination before a competent and disinterested board of three men, at the Aradale hotel, Bedford, on Tuesday, the 18th day of June, instant, between the hours of 10 A. M. and 4 P. M., to select any young man, a resident of the district, and desiring to become a student at West Point, is free to become a competitor. The two young men passing the best examination and physically qualified will be invited to me by said board and their names will be designated to the secretary of war as the proper persons for appointment.
