

FAVOR SILVER.

Sentiment Nearly Unanimous Among Illinois Democrats.

CONVENTION BEING HELD TODAY.

No Prospect of Even a Show of Fight by the Opponents of Free-Silver.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., June 5.—The Democratic convention called by the state central committee to adopt a policy for the party in Illinois upon the money question, convened at noon today.

Every county in the state is represented by its full quota of delegates. The sentiment among the delegates in favor of free silver seems to be nearly unanimous that there is no prospect of even a show of fight from the opposition.

The movement will be directed by a national money convention seems to be gaining force every hour. Judge Goodrich of Chicago is one of the few "sound money" Democrats who are delegates to the convention.

When the silver question is finally forced upon the Republican party, as it must be, it will certainly prove demoralizing. Ultimately the party will be split, and the people's party will gather in all the free silver men of the country.
