LOCAL AND PERSONAL.

John Will, an employe of the sawmill of David Trexler, at Ashville, was caught by a belt on Tuesday afternoon of last week and whirled around the circuit three or four times before the machinery could be stopped.

Two elderly ladies, whose names are unknown, came about as near being the victims of a serious street-car accident in Altoona on Monday evening as was possible to escape.

George Barto, of Blairsville, a compositor on the Pittsburgh Courier, was burned to death in a fire which destroyed that establishment on Friday morning.
