KEEP IT BEFORE THE PEOPLE!

Keep it before the people, that the Republican leaders of this State are pledged to procure the passage of Sumner's bill and negro counts, forcing negro suffrage and other States which are declining to sanction it. The Harbinger strongly and honestly announces that such is the design of the party of which it is the recognized central organ.

This wholesale libel upon men who are among the best farmers and citizens, and compare favorably to morals and industry with any in the North and West, has been readily caught up by the whole Radical pack. Hardly a paper of that political complexion is there now that does not, in some sneer at the "Dutch," a term which Radical ignorance evidently deems the name of disgrace for a citizen of Pennsylvania, and which it has not only indignantly as of course well understood. It arises out of the determination of the Germans to oppose the Puritanical doctrine which obtained here, but which is ascending among the different State legislatures, and aim to restrict the right of individual action.
