NEW JERSEY.

Splendid Democratic Victory in Orange.
ORANGE, N. J., March 10.—In the town election to-day the Democracy won the city of Orange in every ward, and we are elected by a majority of 1,200.

A large gain. The Second ward gives a Democratic majority of sixty. Last year the Radicals carried it by fifteen. The Third ward exactly doubles its majority of last year, the Democratic candidates leading the Radicals by 200 votes.

Democratic Victory and Gain in New Brunswick, N. J.

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., March 10.—The election in New Brunswick, N. J., was held to-day. It resulted in the success of the whole Democratic ticket by over 400 majority, which is a Democratic gain of thirty per cent.

Democratic Victory in Salem, N. J.

SALEM, N. J., March 10.—The election in city offices to-day resulted in the success of the Democratic ticket by a majority of 152—a Democratic gain of about 72.

ON Monday, the 9th, the Louisiana men completed the 8th day of the session, and refused to pass a resolution stopping the pay of members from that date. So far, in round numbers, the cost for salaries has been \$20,000; for printing \$150,000 more—making fully \$250,000.
