farmer readers:—
Rock Wheat.—Some years ago a fine stalk of wheat was found growing among the rocks on Shade Mountain, which when ripe was plucked by Mr. Miller and handed to Joseph Krick, of Decatur township, who has been raising It since, and last fall sowed about four hushels, so that, should it continue to yield as it has done, next year will enable number of farmers to undertake its ultivation. It is a white wheat, with strong straw, remarkably compact heads, grains thin-shelied, and produced at the rate of 48 bushels to the acre, while other wheat in similar ground on the same farm averaged under 16 bushels.

THE POINT OF SUCCESS IN APPLYING

The point to consider in the application of raw manure is its speedy fermen-tation. This is effected readily by surface application, in which case it undergoes decomposition in a short time. The sun has a direct influence upon it, which causes this. Hence it is that surface an plication is so highly beneficial, for with-out decomposition there is little benefit in manure; it is a hindrance rather.— But, the heat decomposing, and the rains washing it in, the work is done.

The next best thing, if not equally as good, and even better perhaps, is to apply on the surface of ploughed ground and harrow in. This mixes it with the top soil and exposes it to the direct rays of the sun, the soil increasing, if any-thing, the heat, and this, in connection with the increased moisture, increasing and accelerating the fermentation. This practice never fails. It is always found to be good and good whether it be rotted or not, providing it can be properly mixed with the soil.

The secret in both these cases is, the sun has its effect. Ploughed in deep, there is a different result-not always successful, especially in cold sqiis, or in wet seasons. Heat and proper hygro-metric condition are necessary.

This, then, is the secret, that we must expose our manures to heat, and the nearer the surface, the more heat and the more fermentation. We have had our best success with manure harrowed in. On meadows, top-dressing is the only way; and the time of application, it is agreed, is the fall or latter part of the summer, when the heat has still its effect and the rains help it.

the manure as it goes into the ground,
and will put it, if left there, out of reach of the grasses and light-rooting grains. It is simply hid. It can be of benefit deep in the ground) only when the soil s porous and of a sandy and dark or heat-attracting nature and the season a warm one. The safe and certain way, however, is top-application. There may be some s, which may not be the case where the ground covers the manure.
