BEAUTIES OF RECONSTRUCTION.

A telegram from Columbia, South Carolina, states that an attempt will be made by the Legislature to turn all the schools of the State over to the negio School Commissioners. In Louis mana, the Board of State School Commissioners is to be presided over by the negro Lieutenant-Governor. Here we have one of the beauties of Radical Reconstruction; white and black children are compelled to attend the same school, alt on the same bench; and recite in the same class, while the schools are to be controlled and managed by negroes. How long will the white freemen of this country submit to this degradation? If they do quietly submit to it, it is evidence they are fit for negro domination and ought to wear the yoke.
