Too much canot be said in favor of lime as a manurial agent. In all composts, of whater materials formed, and for whatver uses designed, it should enter as an ingredient—the quantity being of course graduated by the character and egetative, capacity of the soil to which it is to be applied-the nature f the crop being in a majority of ases merely a collateral consideraion.
