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CYCLONE IN CENTRAL AMERICA.

\$4,000,000 of Property Destroyed—700 Houses Blown Down—Shipping Damaged—Loss of Life.

Parana, Oct. 19.—A severe cyclone passed over the central American States on the 14th and 15th inst.

The town of Managua in Nicaragua was annihilated on the 14th. About 400 houses were blown down by the hurricane.
