HUNDREDS OF LIVES LOST.

Terrible Collision of Two German Ironclads in the British Channel.

London, May 31.—Later.—A dispatch from Dover confirms the worst fears regarding the collision of German ironclads in the English channel, which resulted in most fearful loss of life.

Both vessels were under full headway when the Kaiser Wilhelm ran into the Kaiser Kurfurst. The shock was terrific, the latter vessel filling with water and sinking within five minutes after the collision.

To add to the horror of the situation the boilers of the vessels exploded, scattering death and destruction in every direction. From all reports received, it is believed that nearly 400 persons have lost their lives by the disaster.

London, June 2.—The Pall Mall Gazette says it is now definitely stated that out of 600 men on the German Kurfurst, about 210 were saved, including 13 officers, among whom was the captain, who was not, as previously stated, drowned.

KILLED BY A RAILWAY TRAIN.—Bordenston, N. J., May 31.—A man named McLewance was killed last night between Taylor's Lane and Cambridge, on the Amboy Division of the Pennsylvania Railroad. He was walking on the track. He resided at No. 109 Greenwich st., New York.

MURDER AND SUICIDE BY AN INSANE MOTHER.—St. Louis, Mo., May 31.—Mrs. Thompson, a widow, about fifty years old, highly respected, was killed by her daughter Nettie, about sixteen years old, with a razor, while the latter was sleeping in bed, at Springfield, Mo., Wednesday night last, and then cut her own throat. Temporary insanity, occasioned by sickness, is assigned as a cause for the act.
