#### THE WISCONSIN ANTI-TREATING LAW INOPERATIVE.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., April 16.—In a test case to day to determine the legality of the Anti-Treating law of Wisconsin, it was found that the law was inoperative because of an error in the text of its enactment—the bill as drawn specifying the repeal of an old law that was dropped when the State statutes were recently revised. Judge Millery held the law to be inoperative and void.
