### BEECHER'S SUNDAY SENSATIONS

New York Herald, April 4.

A deep hush fell upon Plymouth Church and every ear was strained when Mr. Beecher said he would relate an incident which he had never spoken of before. He remarked playfully that he would now tell it confidentially. There came to me, he said, a member of my own Church the mother of a young woman, who said that her daughter had become fascinated with the Roman worship and wanted to unite with that Church. I said to her: "Tell your child to wait one year until her own mind and judgment are settled, and if at the end of that time she shall find that she is drawn nearer to God and to heaven through that Church let her come to me and I will take her by the hand and carry her to the door." At the end of the year she was still anxious to enter that Church, and I sat down and wrote a letter to an honored Catholic pastor of this city, and said: "This lamb has found greener pastures in your fields than in mine. She joined the Catholic Church, and is to-day a happy Christian girl in that communion. Any one could have heard at a pin drop while Mr. Beecher was telling this, and there was what is generally called 'a sensation' as he added: 'I'd do it again if it were necessary; for when I speak of the unity of all that believe in the Lord Jesus Christ I mean it.'"

—DIPHTHERIA.—Dr. Gauthier, of St. Paul, Minn., tells in the Chicago Medical Review of his success in an epidemic of diphtheria by the use of iodine. He has treated 20 cases with but two deaths, while before adopting this method he lost one-third of all his cases. The treatment is as follows: The patient is ordered tincture iodine in ten to twelve drop doses every hour, well diluted with water, so long as fever lasts, subsequently reducing to ten drops every two, and finally every three hours. Local applications are made use of at the same time. These latter should be made by the physician at least twice a day. For internal use the decolorized tincture is used. Bread and starchy articles of diet are used in abundance.

DR. URSER'S CURE FOR DRUNKENNESS.—The claims of Dr. Unger for a remedy for curing intemperance would seem to be justified, if we may rely upon as good authority as the Chicago Tribune for the evidence. Mr. Joseph Modill, the editor, is said to be a strong indorseer of the new remedy, and from the editorial commendations of it in the Tribune we can conclude the remedy has produced some benefit to the community already. It is claimed that the doctor has cured 28,000 persons of the worst form of intemperance with it, and that this is the first remedy ever discovered that kills the disease and the inclination to drink at one and the same time.

Remedy.—Take one pound of best, quill red, Peruvian bark, powder it, and soak it in one pint of diluted alcohol. Afterward strain and evaporate it down to half a pint. Directions for its use: Dose—a teaspoonful every three hours the first and second day, and occasionally moisten the tongue between the doses. It acts like quinine, and the patient can tell by a headache if he is getting to much. The third day take as previous, but reduce the dose to fifteen drops, and then down to ten, and then down to five drops. To make a cure, it takes from five to fifteen days, and in extreme cases thirty days. Seven days are about the average in which a cure can be effected.
