During the year fifty-four national banks were organized and twenty went into voluntary fiquidation, leaving 2,136 doing business at the close of the year. No national bank failed during the year. The semi-annual duty accruing from national banks during the year was \$8,493,552 55, making the total amount collected since the establishment of the national banking system in 1863, \$108,855,021.90. At the close of the year there was bield by the Treasurer in United States bonds \$360,505,900 as security for the circulation of national banks and \$15,295. 500 as security for public depositions in actional bank depositories. During the year \$276,899,700 in bonds was deposited for these purposes, and \$277,527,557 withdrawn, exceeding by far the transactions of any former year.
