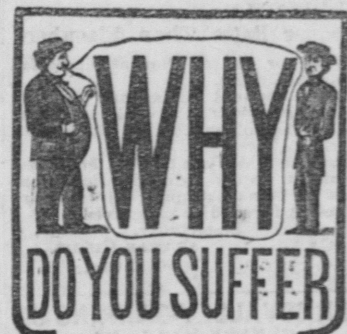

The Chambersburg correspondent of the Baltimore Sun says surveying is active throughout that country for the reputed Vanderbilt road proposed to be extended from Pittsburgh along the Youngboghney to Connellsville, through Bedford, Somerset and other counties into the Cumberland valley, and thence to Harrisburg and Baltimore. It is believed that "tidewater at Baltimore can be reached 276 miles out of Pittsburgh." At present there are five different engineer corps at work among the Allegheny and Blue Ridge Mountains, seeking a route which will be the most feasible. Colonel Thomas P. Roberts is engineer-in-chief, and the corps are in the field at the cost of \$3,500 per month.

The passenger who wants to go by rail from St. Louis to San Francisco now has the choice of five direct routes, of which four are controlled by J. Gould. The Wabash, Missouri Pacific and Iron Mountain roads give four different pathways, and the St. Louis and San Francisco a fifth.

DIPHTHERIA IN SCHOOLS.

The following from the Patriot is applicable to this place as elsewhere and we hope the suggestions of caution contained therein will be promptly acted upon in all cases where necessary. It seems impossible to make people understand that the diphtheritic poison is as communicable as that of small-pox or any other contagious or infectious disease. The maldy is constantly spread by personal contact on the part of persons coming from the sick rooms of diphtheritic patients with healthy persons whose physical condition is such as to be receptive of the poison. Children belonging to families in which there are cases of diphtheria are permitted to attend the public schools just as if the disease were not as contagious and infectious as small-pox. Teachers should be on the alert to prevent communication of the disease by pupils coming from infected houses and the board of control will be remiss in the discharge of its duty if it does not prohibit the attendance of children at public schools whose contact with the disease will be likely to communicate it. No child should be permitted to attend school if the family to which it belongs has been afflicted with diphtheria until the house from which it falls is shown to the board of control to have been thoroughly disinfected and the clothing worn by its diphtheritic inmates burned. If the dread disease is to be stamped out it must be shunned and resisted as people have been taught by the experience of ages to shun and resist the approach of the small-pox. Just now the lives of many children depend without doubt on a proper quarantine of the public schools against the contagion of diphtheria.
