A DOG GUARDING HIS DEAD MASTER.

Lancaster, April 3.—George Blymer, aged forty-five years, a comb-maker, of very intemperate habits, deliberately committed suicide in a horrible manner about noon. He walked from the Pennsylvania railroad about a mile and threw himself directly in front of engine No. 41. The engine and fifteen cars passing over him and severing his head and left arm completely from his body. His dog, which had followed him, stood guard over his body until assistance came. Blymer was discharged from Graham's comb factory for drunkenness and his wife left him. He leaves five children.

A Pennsylvania farmer, living near a railroad station, wanted to sell his farm and adopted a novel method. He sold 188 tickets at \$50 each, making a total of \$9,400. The farm was cut up into 188 lots, varying in value and size, the largest and most valuable being the farm buildings, with twenty-three acres of land, worth about \$3,000. At a stated time the ticket holders assembled at the farm. The tickets were numbered and corresponded with the number of lots, hence there was no blanks. Every holder drew a lot. The wife of the proprietor of a hotel drew the lot of twenty-three acres with the farm buildings. One gentleman was the lucky winner of a corner lot suitable for a store. The gathering was an occasion that will long be remembered in the place where it occurred.
