All stains should be removed from white goods before they are wet or put into the wash. To temper a glass jar so that it can be at once filled with anything hot, put

into it a silver spoon. An excellent furniture polish is of equal parts of shellac varnish, linseed oil and spirits of wine.

After washing cut-glass articles let them dry thoroughly and then rub with prepared chalk and a soft brush. To prevent discoloration from bruises apply a cloth rung out in very hot water, and renew frequently until the pain

To remove ink-stains from linen, put the stained part in pure melted tallow; then wash out the tallow, and the ink will disappear.

Do not put glass articles that have held milk into hot water, as this causes the milk to penetrate the glass, and it can never be removed. The best and easiest way to clean

white paint is to use enough spirits of ammonia to soften the water, and ordinary hard soap, and rub well.

A little powdered resin sprinkled on to a cut will prevent inflammation; put a soft cloth around the finger and wet

it with water frequently. To clean copper tea-kettles, use tur-pentine and fine brick-dust, and rub hard with a flannel, and polish with a
