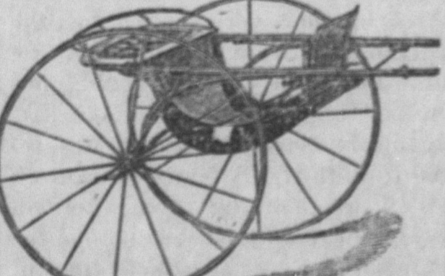

## THE CENTRE REPORTER.

The Selingsgrove Tribune publishes the confession of Jonathan Moyer, which was given to Rev. Reed with a request that it should not be made public until after his death as well as that made by Uriah. It is as follows: "About three weeks before the Kintzler murder was committed, Emanuel Ettinger came to my house, and asked me whether I would not go with him to get the Kintzler money? That he would kill them, or (wolt's sie umbringen.) I said no."

"On Thursday previous, when the murder was committed, my brother Uriah came to me in the woods, where I was splitting wood, and asked me whether I would go along to get Kintzler's money? He said there was one, or some one, who would kill them. In talking the matter over I said unconcernedly, 'may be it won't matter much, as it might be there would not be much fuss about it.' But after he had gone away a short distance, but too far to hear me, I thought over it, and got alarmed, I turned to call to him and tell him he should not go with Emanuel Ettinger, but he was too far gone. I could not call him back. From that time on, I thought very little about it until on Saturday, when I went down to Uriah's for a walk, and see if they were done butchering. Emanuel Ettinger said to me when we were alone, 'I will tell you something, if you don't tell on me, or won't say anything.' Then he said, 'will you go along to make a haul?' I asked him what haul? He said, 'why the Kintzlers are dead,' he showed me some watch glasses to convince me of the truth of the story. He then told me how it happened, and said, 'I want you to go along for the money, that won't hurt you, it is just as good for us as for anybody else. If we don't go and get it somebody else will, and if you go along, you certainly shall have your share, just as though you had been along from the first.' I then asked him if the old man screamed? He said, 'not much,' I then said I am surprised that you told me this, he said, 'yes I told you too much some time ago.' We then went to my house, and when we left we told the woman-folks that we were going for rabbits, but they did not go with us. I was not at the killing, he were but two, but I was at the burning, there were three, that was on Saturday evening. Uriah can tell you the particulars about the killing, he was along, so they told me. It seems to me that a conversation with Uriah once before the killing, I said, 'I wonder if we could not sneak about the premises and shoot old Kintzler and get the money without being found out?' I want to confess all. The burning was on Saturday night, the old man was carried into the house, we hunted through the house but only found about \$78.00, which we divided in Uriah's cellar. After we got all the money the house was fired, and we went home. I have now told all, and it is the God's truth.

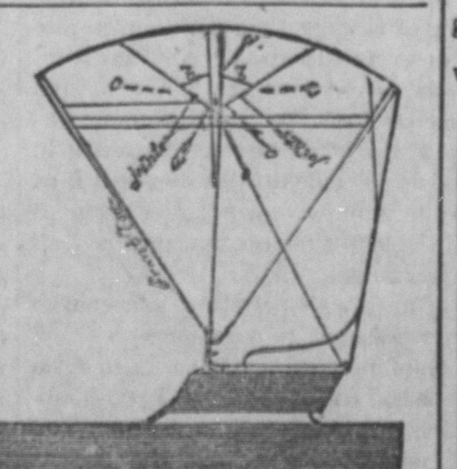
