100 PERSONS DROWNED AT A LAUNCH AT GLASGOW.

London, July 3.—Intelligence has just reached this city of an unusual and terrible calamity during the launch of a steamship at Glasgow to-day. The vessel to which the disaster happened was the steamer Daphne.

According to the statements of the witnesses and survivors of the disaster the vessel left the ship too rapidly causing her stern, which entered first, to sink in the water. She was then caught by the strong current of the river, which, as well as by her top weight, she was caused to keel over so far that the water entered her ports.
