HOW INDIANA WAS CARRIED.

[From Dora's Interview in Chicago Herald.]

"But," said the correspondent, "that is indefinite. Here you are distinctly charged with having run things in Indiana, having won the fight and having been rewarded with a banquet in New York."

"There is nothing in the Indiana campaign to be ashamed of. We took the means that were available to carry the State and we carried it."

"But how? Simply organization—no money?"

"Why, yes. I said before it took money."

"How much was used, in round figures?"

"Four hundred thousand dollars."

"And how was that money expended?"

"Oh, now you are going down too deeply. However, perhaps I can give you some idea when I say there were 1,600 and more townships in the State, and that in each of these townships we had three good, honest, square Republicans to canvass the whole vote, find out what was wanted in their townships to change the complexion of their affairs or help to do it, and report to us at Indianapolis when the time came. Each one of these men, nearly 5,000 in number, reported what they could do and how much it would take to influence people to a change of thought. We paid \$20 to some and as high as \$75 to others, but we took care that the three men from every township should know just what each got. There was no chance for 'niggling.' There, that's all there was in carrying Indiana in October. You mustn't ask me to go any deeper into particulars, for I won't do it."

HIGH LICENSE AND PROHIBITION.

The difference between high license and prohibition was never better illustrated anywhere than in Kansas City last Sunday. It is well known that Kansas City is part in Missouri and part in Kansas, with nothing but an imaginary line dividing the two. This line runs along the centre of a street. In Missouri they have a high license law, and in Kansas the sale of all kinds of liquor is totally prohibited. The high license law of Missouri prohibits the sale on Sunday. Sunday week was the first since the Supreme Court had affirmed the constitutionality of the law, and the officers had announced that they intended to enforce its provisions. It was impossible in the Missouri part of the city to get a glass of liquor, while over on the Kansas side the saloons of all kinds were kept open, and the thirsty Missourians had nothing to do but to cross the street to get all they wanted. Never before was there as quiet and orderly a Sunday in Kansas City proper. A high license law with stringent provisions, can be enforced, and the sale of intoxicants thus restrained to a great extent, while with the present public sentiment prohibition cannot be enforced to an extent that will accomplish the end sought for. The attention of practical temperance men everywhere is being turned toward the question of high license, and there is a probability that temperance legislation will take a decided step forward. In Kansas city the license is now \$1,250. This high license shuts off the worst of saloons.

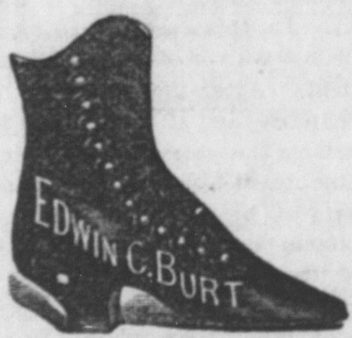
