One of the most striking features of modern French life is the rapid increase of insanity, the number of cases of which, and especially those induced by alcoholism, is becoming larger each year. During 1882 there were 13,434 admissions into the asylums, of which 10,181 were new cases, the total number under treatment in the year being 58,760, of which 27,000 were men and 31,000 women, showing that females are the most liable to the disease. That they are less influenced by treatment is shown by the fact that the average duration of treatment for men is 276 days, while for women it is 295 days. The following statistics represent the character of the brain diseases and the average time that each class requires for supervision in the asylums : Simple insanity, 33,629 patients' average time 287 days; softening of brain and paralysis, 8,665, average time 250 days; senile dementia, 4,495, average time 189 days; idiots and Cretins, 5,377, average time 298 days. The latter, therefore, appears to be the most intractable form. In all France there are only 61 public and 42 private asylums, of which 9 are for men only, and 14 for women only, the remainder being for both sexes. No fewer than 31 departments have no establishment whatever for the care and treatment of the insane.

THE CHAZIE APPLE.

The famous Chazie apples, which are the most admired and expensive of all Canadian varieties, and sometimes fetch as much as \$25 a barrel in Covent Garden, London, were not, according to the Pall Mall Gazette, introduced from France into the colony, but were discovered by a lucky accident. Chazie, a Dutchman, was well advanced in years in 1854. He owned a farm a few miles distant from the Falls of Niagara, and on that farm he found growing wild a tree bearing the apple known as the Chazie-or "Swayzie," as some writers spell the name. Some one had flung away the core of an apple; one of the seeds had sprouted, and grown into a tree bearing an apple with the flavor of the muskmeion, double the size of the Lower Canada pomme grise, and of the same color and form.

SINGING SANDS.

The superintendents of the various life-The superintendents of the various life-saving stations have been instructed to furnish, for scientific purposes, samples of the so-called "singing sand," wherever found. These sands get their name from the peculiar sound which they give forth when walked upon or disturbed in any way. This property is possessed only by dry sand found between the water line and extreme high-tide marks along the seacoast and the shores of the great lakes. Already twenty-six samples of this sort of sand have been received, indicating its existance in as many different localities in this country. Heretofor these strange singing beaches have only been known to exist in two places, one in this country and the other in Europe.
