COWBOYS KILL NINE MEN.

Helens, Montana, August 10.-Meager particulars are received of another slaughter of horse-thieves in the Muscleshell region, 150 miles northeast of here, by cowboys. While in pursuit of stolen horses, a log-house was discovered in the timber on the mountain side. It was secretly watched a day or two, during which time several small parties of men came and went, some by day, others by night, having in possession horses, evi. dently stolen. It becoming evident that vessel. it was a horse-thieves' rendezvous, cowboys congregated, and last Monday night crawled up close to the house and attacked fourteen horse-thieves, about the premises at the time.
