At one time these sold readily at \$150; now they go at \$90. The difference between \$150 and \$90 is \$60-a loss of \$60 a share for 350,000 shares is a total loss of \$21,000,000 in New York Central alone Lake Shore has 500,000 shares ; of this Vanderbilt owned 200,000. In 1881 this was at \$135; now it is at \$65-loss per share, \$70-a total loss on 200,000 shares, \$14,000,000. This added to the loss on the Central, aggregates \$35,000,000 on these two roads alone. From this is to be deducted something for stock sold while it was falling, perhaps, \$5,000,000. But then we must add a good deal on account of his well meant and desperate but futile atlempts of Mr. Vanderbilt to keep the stocks up. When Central was at \$125, he would put a few millions in and buy, and this would send it up to \$135 for a week, during which he would buy again heavily, and then the whole would slamp to \$110. These ball tactics repeated over and over every fall, have resulted in enormous losses, which must be added to the \$35,000,000 above mentioned. But these losses prove the cincerity of Mr. Vanderbiit. San Francisco, Oct. 28 .- The steam ar from Japan brings further details of t ne esteem mighty gold above all things typhoon at Yokohama and Tokio on S aptember 15th. The storm came up so 'rapidly and with such tremendous fury that no precautions could be taken. In Y oko. hama the entire lower part of the town was completely wrecked. Not a house was left standing. The newspaper s give no particulars, simply saying that the town was wiped out, and it is the arefore of the town 128 houses were de stroyed and 390 damaged, the most substantial structures being swept away as if built of pasteboard. At sea fifty-three orit of eighty sairing vessels were lost, with 223 passengers. Twelve vessels, with 120 per-sons, are still missing. Of five life,boats going to succor drowning craws, forr were swamped and ten men of their crews drowned.


