LEMON PIE .- Two lemons; grate off the outer peel; chop the rest very fine; put two tablespoons of corn starch in one teacup of water and boil; when cool add two teacups of white sugar, the beaten yolks of four eggs, then add the chopped peel and the juice; stir well together, bake till the crust is done-only one crust, beat the whites of the 4 eggs to a stiff froth, add five tablespoonfuls of sugar, stirring in well, pour over the pie while hot, set in the oven to brown.

An excellent pudding is made in this way: Cut apples into halves, peel and core them, put some dates or prunes from which the stones have been removed in the place of the cores; cover them with cold boiled rice, moisten the rice well with milk and water, putting in enough so that the apples will not burn down to the bottom of the dish; bake in a moderate oven for an hour; cover the pudding dish is there danger of the rice becoming too brown; serve with sauce made of one well-beaten egg, one pint of milk, one cup of sugar, a little grated nutmeg or mace.

Bomed Duck .- Dress and rab inside with pepper and salt; truss and tie in shape, drawing the legs into the body, in which put one or two leaves of sage, a finely chopped onion and a little jel lied soup stock; rub over with sait and pepper; make a paste in the proportion of one-half pound of butter to one pound of flour, in which inclose the duck; tie a cloth around all and boil constantly for two hours; make a gravy by boiling a tablespoonful of butter, a tablespoonful of flour, a minced onion and a pint of flour.

Fig Pupping,-One-half pound good dried figs, washed, wiped and minced; two cups fine dry bread crumbs, three eggs, one-half cup beef suet, powdered; two scant cups sweet milk, one-half cup of white sugar, a little salt, one-fourth teaspoonful baking powder, dissolved in hot water and stirred into the milk. Soak the crumbs in the milk, add the eggs benten light with sugar, salt, suct and figs. Beat three minutes, put in buttered mold with tight top, set in boiling water with weight on cover to prevent mold from upsetting and boil three hours.

A DISH which is regarded with favor just now is make by boiling some beets until they are perfectly tender, then chop them fine and mix with them an equal quantity of stewed tomatoes; heat them to the boiling point; season with pepper and salt and a little lump of butter; send to the table very hot.

When roasting lamb or fowls, if you do not like the flavor given by thin slices of salt pork or bacon, which are usually put over them, take some hard butter, roll it in flour, and separate it into small lumps and lay here and there on the meat. This will give richness and flavor to the liquid with which you baste them.

CELEBY SAUCE. - Cut a bunch of celery into small pieces and boil gently in water till tender; add some beaten mace, nutmeg, pepper and salt and butter rolled in flour; boil up and serve with fowl or game.

MADE MUSTARD. -- Four tablespoonfuls English mustard, two teaspoonfuls salt, two teaspoonfuls white sugar, two teaspoonfuls salad oil, one teaspoonful pepper, vinegar to make a smooth paste; rub mustard, oil, pepper and sait together, wet by degrees with vinegar, beating very hard at the last, when proper consistency has been gained.
