

BERMUDA ONIONS. - Seeing some fine Bermuda onions about as large around as a tea saucer and weighing one pound and a half each, grown by Mr. H. S. Elliott, we called on him to learn his mode of culture, etc., which we give briefly as follows: Fertilized with fish guano, 1,000 pounds to the acre, broadcast with small amount of ashes and stable rakings, cost in all \$40 per acre. There is nothing fanciful about these figures; they are the results of actual experience, and should the crop be cut off half by drought or other mishap, the net profits would then be over seven hundred dollars per acre, which is pretty fair farming.

VALUE OF THE SUNFLOWER, -Agriculturists claim it is the best egg producing food known for poultry, keeping them in a thriving condition and largely increasing the production of eggs. Every poultry raiser who tries it will find that this seed is the best food known for glossing the plumage of fowls, and is almost indispensable to those whe want to fit their birds for exhibition to the best advantage. The Russian sunflower is easily raised, requires very little care, can be grown in fence corners, or other places difficult to cultivate. Its production of seed is immense, yielding often at the rate of one hundred bushels to the acre. It should be planted in hills four feet apart, any time from the tenth of May to the first of July. Three quarts of seed will plant an acre

AGRICULTURE.

ATPLES AU BEURRE. - Apples au beurre are nice for lunch. Peel and core the apples. Take slices of stale bread a quarter of an inch thick, and then cut them in round pieces about the size of the apple with a paste cutter. Butter each piece, place an apple upon it and fill the hole in the apple with sugar, putting a piece of butter the size of a hazelnut on top. Place the apples and bread in a buttered baking dish, and set in a moderate oven. When half done fill the hole again with sugar, add a pinch of cinnamon, put butter on top as before, and bake until done; serve warm. When the apples are done they may be glazed with apple jelly and put back in the oven for two minutes; this improves the looks of the dish.

PRETTY MANTEL VALANCES. - Mantel valances are now the fashion, and every room in the house must be adorned with one. For housekeepers who have not time to embroider or crochet them, very pretty ones are made out of the flowered chintz, which comes in stripes eight or ten inches broad. One made at a cozy home was in pink and deep brown stripes, with moss roses scattered on each, which, at a little distance, looked as though embroidered. A fringe of blue, brown, pink and white worsted was crocheted to the edge, and the whole was fastened on a shelf with silver-headed tacks

VEAL STEW. - Cut four pounds of veal into strips three inches long and one inch thick, peel twelve large potatoes and cut them into slices an inch thick, spread a layer of veal on the bottom of pot, sprinkle in a little salt and pepper, then layer of potatoes, then layer of veal seasoned as before. In the morning add one-half teaspoonful of salt, one teaspconful soda, two eggs, well beaten. Bake on a hot griddle and the result is a foamy griddle cake.
