



CURRANT JELLY .- Weigh the currants without removing their stems. Do not wash them, but carefully remove leaves and whatever foreign substance may have formed an attachment to them. To each pound of fruit allow half the weight of granulated sugar. Put a few currants into a porcelain-lined kettle; mash them with anything that comes handy; add a teaspoonful of water and the rest of the fruit, and boil for twenty minutes, stirring often to prevent scorching. Strain through a three-cornered bag made of some strong rather close texture into either earthen or wooden vessels; never use tin. When strained return the liquid to the kettle, let it boil for two or three minutes, not more, and add sugar. The very moment the sugar is entirely dissolved the jelly is done and must be immediately placed in glasses. Gather the fruit as soon as ripe, but do not

basis of many sauces, its preparation is important. Put into a small saucepan two ounces of soft, fresh butter and a large tablespoonful of flour. Mix these well together, with a wooden spoon, and then add about half a pint of cold water, nearly a teaspoonful of sait and a little white pepper. Set this over the fire and stir it continually until nearly boiling. The ingredients ought to be perfectly blended; but the butter, from bad quality or other cause, will fre-quently float as oil on the surface, This imperfection may be partially remedied by adding a little cold water, and then pouring the sauce quickly from the saucepan into a basin and back again several times. When prepared for other sauces less water may be used if the flavoring additions are fluid, and rather more where these, as in egg







PHN POINT.

Soda .-- Soda is an alkali which was formerly obtained in large quantities from the ashes of kali and various other marine plants growing on the shores of the Mediterranean sea, and to which ashes the name of barrilla is given; a more impure soda was obtained from kelp, which is the ashes of different sea-weeds found on the coasts of Ireland and Scotland; a large trade was formerly carried on in these articles, but it is now found cheaper to make so-da by the decomposition of salt. The salt is put into a furnace, and sulphuric acid poured upon it; the heat first melts it, and then roasts it into sul-phate of soda, or salt-cake, as it is called; this is atterwards put into another furnace with an equal weight of car-bonste of lime, either in the form of limestone or chalk, and half its weight of small coal; the whole is subjected of small coal; the whole is subjected to intense heat; during which many chemical changes take place. The mass, when raked out to cool, consists of black-ash and ball soda, it is after-wards separated from insoluble impuri-ties by being dissolved in warm water, and, after being further purified in the furnace, becomes the soda of commerce making is in fact carbonate of soda. which is in fact carbonate of soda.



CURRANT VINEGAR .- This vinegar is made by simply pressing the fruit to a mash, let it stand a night, then strain the juice off clear and fill bottles to the brim. Set them uncorked in the sun. or in a warm place, until the fermentation ceases, any little impurity that rises, skim off with a piece of blotting-paper, and cork the bottles well. White currants are excellent for delicate pale vinegar. Red ones make a vinegar equal to that made from the finest red.



QUINCE LIQUEUR. -- Ripe yellow quin-ces must be washed and wiped dry, not peeled; grate them on a coarse grater; sprinkle powdered loaf sugar among them and let them stand till next day, then press and fliter the juice; to every pint of this add an equal quanty of proof spirit and half a pound of fine sugar. Let the liqueur stand a fort-night, shaking the bottle occasionally.
