LIFE IN HOLLAND. To study the real, every-day life of Holland one would have to leave the large cities and visit the towns and villages, many of which cannot boast of the modern luxury of a railway. Take such a town as Hoorn, and, although its picturesque has, I think, been exaggerated by some writers, it is undoubtedly, with Alkmaar close by, a good section to learn something of Dutch customs and rural life. It is only within a few months that Hoorn could boast of a railroad. There this grave old town has stood for centuries on the Zuider Zee. For miles before it is reached one sees the high embankment or sea wall that has reclaimed and made land for the track on which the locomotive runs. Generations of sleepy, easy-going people have passed in procession from the cradle to the grave since the days when Hoorn was known and felt in the world. They have dwelt, to be sure, in the same old houses, with narrow, steep stairways, black oaken beams and gable roofs, that seem to nod and wink and look tipsy, and jolly and funny at each other to this day. The doors and the window frames of these houses are painted to-day with the same colors as in the days when the fleet of Hoorn started to take the town of London. Green, black, yellow and pink are gay colors for such a frowsy old place as Hoorn. What the people of Hoorn do is a mystery to me. A few of them leisurely drive about in long, narrow, dark green wagons, with solid wooden axles. Springs are taxed in Holland, so the poor cannot afford them on their vehicles. Others seem to be engaged in scouring milkpans in narrow streets, and by far the majority stand around and stare curiously, though not rudely, at strangers, wondering, no doubt, what one can see in Hoorn to make it worth a visit.

OLD FOGYISM. The rubs, disappointments and sorrows of a hard world make lots and a necessity, and what most interests us is always seen through a lotus land mist. Youth looks forward, age backward, through this magical haze. What is ambition in the one becomes old foggism in the other, and both are living in air-castles and develop their best thoughts and actions in this unreal abode. Fashion has changed much, but it has not changed the deeper tissue of the heart, or the deeper nerve organization of the brain. It has written the benumbing remains untouched by its decrees. Fashion itself has its old foggy dreams, and the world-hardened cynical old dowager herself, who has closed her ears to praise or censure, nods paralytically before her fire and finds her lotus land in the flaming coils. An old foggy is not old, though he be a patriarch as to years; age may have shriveled his flesh, robbed him of his teeth and distorted his joints with rheumatism, but the sap of youth is untouched in his heart. He is the real and only successful alchemist; he has discovered the virgin earth called "old foggism," and by its aid is enabled to convert all the baser metals of life into pure and uncorrupted gold.

THE TALLEST RACE. Careful measurements have been made in recent times, by different observers, of many individuals in various parts of Patagonia. The result is that the mean stature of adults (of both sexes, if mean stature appears), is found to be about 1.78 meters, or five feet ten inches English. This mean may seem rather low, but if we compare it with that of France, which is only 1.65 meters (about five feet five inches), and if we consider that for all humankind the statistics give only 1.70 meters (rather less than five feet eight inches), we shall perceive that this figure represents in reality a very lofty stature, and makes the Patagonians the tallest race now existing. Men of six feet French (six feet three and one-half inches English) are common among them, and occasionally one is found who reaches two meters, or six feet six and one-half inches.
