SETH KINMA'NS KINDNESS.

He will Present Mr. Cleveland with a Rare

Seat. Seth Kinman is the most noted hunter on the Pacific Slope. His home is at Ta ble Bluff, Humboit county, Cal., but the greafer portion of his time is spent in the wilds of that great State. Seth celebrated his seventieth birthday on the 6th of last month. He was born in Union co. this State. His early manhood was spent in Illinois. In 1848 he crossed the plaius to Oregan, where he remained two or three years. He returned to Illinois, but in 1849 again crossed the plains and settled in California, where he has made his home ever since. His fame as a daring hunter and trapper is broader than his State. He has killed the largest grizzly ever known in the Rockeys. Fortune has smiled upon him and he lives a life of luxuriors ease. He has just completed ajchair which he proposes to pre-sent in person to President Cleveland. In a letter to a business firm in Pittsburgh, from whom he purchases stores, he describes the chair as being one of the finest he has ever made, although he has completed and presented four Presidential chairs. All his chairs have been fashioned from sections of wild animals. The first he presented to President Buchanan on May 23, 1857. The second he gave to President Lincoln on November 29, 1864. The third he presented to President Johnson on September 8, 1865 and the fourth he delivered to R. B Hays on September 17, 1876. He accompanies each gift in person, and the number of chairs presented denotes the number of his visits to his native state.

The chair now ready for President Cleveland and which will be delivered soon, is formed entirely from elks captured by himself, save a band of steel and some cord. The horns of six elks were used, Four horns were used for the legs; at the end of each is attached the cloven hoofs of the animal. The seat is constructed by stretching an elk hide with the hair up over the steel band. The hide is secured in its place by strong cords underneath, which cross each other at right angles, and the whole forms an easy, comfortable seat. An elk horn on either side forms the arms. The horn tips, which branch out from the chair most aggressively, represent the thirty-eight States and ten Territories in the Union. It is highly polished and is fit to decorate a throne.

Detroit, Mich. Nov. 11 .- An Owen Sound, Ontario, dispatch says: as far as can be learned the passenger list and crew of the Algonia comprised over 120 persons. DRINKABLE SEA-WATER,

A simple plan of making sea-water palatable would be a great boon to mariners cast away in boats or rafts, and also to our naval forces. Mr. Thomas Kay has recently shown that the baneful effects of sea-water as a drink are chiefly due to the presence of chlorine, which is combined with sodium and magnesium, It produces thirst and scurvy, when taken in excess. In order to remove the chlorine, he mixes sea-water with a certain proportion with citric acid, or silver citrate, and thus produces what may be called a mild mineral water, which is drinkable, and, being nearly free from precipitated chlorine, is not injurious to health when taken in moderate quantities. At a recent meeting in Manchester, England, he treated a pint of water brought from beyond the Eddystone with 960 grains of citrate of silver, and four grains of free citric acid. Silver chloride was precipitated and the overlying liquid decanted and filtered. Each fluid ounce of it contained about eighteen grains of citrate of soda, one-and-a-half grains of citrate of magnesia, half a grain of citrate of potash, one grain of sulphate of magnesia, half a grain of sulphate of lime, one-fifth grain of citric acid, and less than half a grain of undecomposed chlorides. The salts o' soda in this liquid are diuretic, the salts of magnesia aperient, hence it posesses medicinal properties. It could be safely used to moisten the tongue and throat, and drunk in small quantities. The citrate of silver employed to treat the water should be kept in a stoppered bottle, covered with india rubber, so as to exclude light, air, and organic matter, as it is easily decomposed. As an ounce of citrate silver converts half a pint of sea-water, a man may keep alive for a day upon it. Seven ounces will, it is therefore inferred, keep him alive for a week, and it has been proposed to stow bottles of the salt under the thwarts of life-boats, and in the lockers of certain life-buoys, which carry restoratives.

Science asserts that experiments indicate the possibility of obtaining an echo from an iceberg when in a danger ous proximity to a ship. It is believed that even an object offering so small a surface as a floating wreck may in this way be detected during a fog in time to prevent a collision. Experiments recently made have demonstrated the feasibility of producing well-marked echoes from sailing vessels and from steamboats considerable distances away. The apparatus employed consisted of a musket, to the muzzle of which a speakgun was aimed at passing vessels, while blank-cartridges were fired. 
