The Household.

To RESTORE VELVET. - Where velvet has been crushed, hold the wrong side Confectionery, Fruits, Nuts over a basin of quite boiling water, and the pile will gradually rise. Do not lose patience, for it takes a considerable time, but the result is marvellous.

Baking powder and soda biscuits should be put into warm pans, and baked in a quick oven; a little warm water rubbed over them just before putting into the oven will give them a nice color.

A PRETTY device to set off a small oil painting or water color drawing is to have a graceful bird with bright plumage holding on the upper portion of the frame by its beak and claws as if trying to get a footing.

HICKORY CARE. - One-half cup of butter, two cups of sugar, and four eggs, beaten separately; three cups of flour, one-half cup of sweet milk, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, two cups of hickory nut meat minced, one teaspoonful extract of vanilla.

FRUIT PUDDING.-Chop a pineapple quite fine; take some cake which is a little dry, rub it fine in your hands or crush it on a kneeding board; put it BELLEFONTE, PA., No. 8, Brockerhoff Row into a pudding dish in alternate layers with the pineapple, sweeten abundantly, moisten with cold water and bake in a moderate oven for an hour and three-

THREE teaspoonfuls of tea, made hot first in the dry teapot before adding the hot water, will give you a stronger and better "drawing" than four which are thrown into a cold teapot and immediately deluged with boiling water. There is a fine art in making tea, and it is very easily learned.

OIL FOR FURNITURE -Boil together cold drawn linseed oil and as much alkanet root as it will cover, and to every quart of oil add two ounces of the best rose pink; when all the color is extracted strain it off, and for every quart add a gill of spirits of turpentine; it will be a very superior composition for soft and light mahogany.

COCOANUT PIE -One pint of milk, a eocoanut, teacupful sugar. three eggs, grate cocoanut, mix with the yolks of the eggs and sugar; stir in the milk, filling the pan even full, and bake. Beat whites of eggs to a froth, stirring three tablespoonfuls pulverized sugar, pour over pie and bake to a light brown. If prepared cocoanut is used one heaping teacupful is required.

GREEN TOMATO PICKLE OR CHOW-CHOW. -Take one peck of green tematoes, two quarts of green peppers without the seeds and two quarts of onions. Chop all fine and mix with three large cupfuls of salt, letting the mixture stand over night. In the morning drain well and add one cupful of horse radish, half a pound of mustard seed, two tablespoonfuls of ground allspice and two tablespoonfuls of ground cloves.

In case of a burn or scald, the essential thing is to exclude the air from the paid. injured member as quickly and as completely as possible. This may be accomplished by immersing the injured part fn water, not too cold, and then as quickly as may be, cover with flour to the depth of an inch, if possible, withdrawing the burned part from the water only as fast as the flour can be applied, thus preventing pain. Caution: Never apply cotton wool or cotton batting to a burn, and do not use soda on a barn unless the skin remains whole.


