RDINANCES ADOPTED BY THE Town Council of the Borough of Centre Hall, Pennsylvania.

ADOPTION OF STREETS.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Centre Hall, Centre County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same:

That the Lewistown and Bellefonte turnpike road, and the Brush Valley road, as they are now located through the said Borough, are adopted and ordained as streets, and not to be changed unless ordered by special resolutions of Councils; the former to be known and designated as Penn Avenue, and the latter as Church Street.

PAVEMENTS-CONSTRUCTIONS.

Section 1—That all pavements and sidewalks constructed along the street in front or along the side of all the lots or grounds within the limits of the Borough shall be six (6) feet wide, including curb stone, and in front of or along side of all unimproved lots and other lands within the borough not less than four (4) feet wide, unless otherwise ordered by special resolution of Town Council.

Section 2-That whenever ordered by resolution of Town Council, it shall be the duty of the Street Commissioner to notify the owner or owners (his or her their agents or tenants occupying such premises) of any lot or lots of ground, or ther lands within the limits of the Borough fronting or extending along any street, to construct and put down at the grade established by the Borough Engineer, or other competent authority, and of the width established by ordinance or resolution of Council, a good and sub-stantial pavement or side-walk; and upon failure or neglect of such owner or owners, their agents or tenants in possession to cause said pavement or sidewalk to be constructed as herein provided, within thirty days after such no-tice, it shall be the duty of the Street Commissioner to cause said pavements or side-walks to be so constructed of such material as he may select, and report the expense incurred in constructing such pavement or side-walk to the Clerk of the Council, whose duty it shall be to enter said bill with an addition of twenty per cent. in a book for that purpose and to furnish the attorney of council with a certified copy of such account and entry; and if such bill or bills as rendershall be allowed to proceed, said sum to ed by the Street Commissioner, with the twenty per cent. additional, shall not be paid within ten days after notice, then the same shall be entered as a lien against the property or properties along which such pavements or side-walks were so constructed, as provided by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania relating to boroughs.

SECTION 3-That it shall be the duty of the owner or owners of all lots, or other lands within the Borough, in front of the Borough or any cow or other cattle or along side of which pavements or side-walks have been built or construct and 5 o'clock a. m., they shall be immeed to keep the same in good repair; and diately seized by the High Constable and if any owner or owners as aforesaid shall taken to the pound and therein confined. ct or refuse for ten days after notice by the Street Commissioner to have such pavement or side-walk repaired (if out of repair) it shall be the duty of the Street Commissioner to have the same repaired and to return a bill of the costs of such repairs with an addition of twenty per cent to the Clerk of the Council to be collected in the same manner as provided by Section 2d in reference to constructing pavements or side-walks.

Secrios 5—If the next to such building, or lot upon which such building is to be erected, or repaired, with all necessary building materials used in the erection or repairing of any such buil ing, and if necessary such per-mission shall be extended for an additional period of six months, and so on until such building or buildings shall be

Secretor 2-That if any person or persons shall occupy or cause to be occupied any street or alley in the limits of the Borough with any building materials for the erection or repairing of any building without first having obtained a written permit from the Clerk of the Couneil, or shall obstruct any gutters or pavements with such material, he or they so offending shall pay for the use of the Borough the sum of Fifty cents for each and every day such street or alley is so occupied, or such gutter or pavement is obstructed, to be recovered in the same manner as debts of like amount are now

recoverable by law. SECTION 3 -That if any person or persons shall place any building materials upon any of the s reets or alleys of the Borough without a written permit from the Clerk of Council, or shall obstruct any gutter, pavement or side-walk, it shall be the duty of the Street Commissioner to notify him or them to remove such materials or obstructions, and in case of neglect or refusal to do so within five days after notice, the Street Commissioner shall remove same at the cost and expense of the person or persons so offending, to be recovered in the same manner as debts of like amount are now recoverable by law.

That all owners of lots, grounds or other real estate insaid Borouch, fronting on any of the streets of said Borough, shall construct at their own expense such pavements or side-walk as the Council shall direct either by ordinance or resolution.

SECTION 1—If any person or persons shall in any manner, or upon any pretence whatever, except in the case of building or repairing, occupy as tence whatever except in the case of building or repairing, occupy an part of any street, alley, pavement or side-walk, with wood, timber, boards, coal, brick, with wood, timber, boards, coal, brick, sand, rubbish, or any other material sand, rubbish, rubbish ty-four hours, he or they so offending injure the same, shall pay a fine not ex-Bull forfeit and pay the sum of One ceeding Five Dollars.

Dollar for each and every offense.

Section 2-If any person or persons shall put or place any manure, fence, wall, building, impediment or obstruction in any of the streets, alleys, or public grounds, or cause the same to be done, he or they so offending shall forfeit and pay the sum of One Dollar for each and

every offense. Section 3—If any person or persons shall put or place, or cause to be put or placed within the limits of the Borough, the carcass of any dead animal, or any offal, or filth whatever, he or they so offending shall forfeit and pay the sum of Two Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 4—That all forfeitures or penalties imposed by forgoing sections of this ordinance shall be recovered in the same manner as debts of like amount are now recoverable by law.

That the owners of real estate in said Borough fronting on any of the streets in said Borough, shall at their own expense construct such gutters or drains along such real estate, between the pavements and the streets, as the Council shall direct, either by ordinance or reso-

Section 1—That whenever requested by resolution of Town Council, it shall be the duty of the Street Commissioner to notify the owner or owners (their agents or tenants in possession) of any lot or lots of ground or any other lands, imoroved or unimproved, within the limits of the Borough, to construct gut-ters in front or along side of such lots or land between the pavement and streets in accordance with the directions of the Borough Engineer, or other competent authority; and upon failure or neglect of such owner or owners, their agents or tenants in possession, to cause such gutters to be constructed within thirty days after such notice, it shall be the duty of the Street Commissioner to cause such gutters to be constructed of such material as he may select, and report the ex-pense incurred to the Clerk of the Coun-cil, who shall enter said bill, with an addition of twenty per cent., in a book to be kept for that purpose, and to furnish the attorney of council with a certified copy of said bill and entry so made; and if the amount of said bill, with the twenty per cent. additional, shall not be paid within ten days after notice, then the same shall be entered as a lien against such real estate according to the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania relating to boroughs.

TAXES ON SHOWS.

That the proprietor or agent of every show or exhibition, that charges admission, shall pay a sum not exceeding Ten shall be allowed to proceed, said sum to be collected by the Burgess, and the amount to be paid to be fixed by the said Burgess, in no case, however, to exceed the sum of Ten Dollars; and the sum so collected shall be for the use of

DUTIES OF HIGH CONSTABLE.

Section 1-If any horses, mules, goats, sheep or swine shall at any time be suffered to run at large within the limits of

Secrion 2-All animals so taken shall be in the custody of the High Constable, and it shall be his duty to sufficiently care for such animals while confined.

SECTION 3-The High Constabl shall keep a register wherein he shall enter a full description of all animals confined in the pound, the time so confined, the costs of keeping, the name of owner if known, and the name of the purchaser when sold, and the price received ther-

Section 4-If no owner shall appear and claim such animals within forty-

Secrion 5-If the owner or owners of such animals shall appear at any time before the sale has acctually occurred and pay all legal and necessary costs incurred, such animal or animals shall be delivered to the owner, and if not claimed by the time fixed for the sale, the High Constable shall sell such animals to the highest bidder, first deducting his legal costs and necessary expenses, and the balance if any to be passed to the

SECTION 1-That the Council shall elect one person to serve as Street Commissioner; one person to serve as Chief of Police, and as many others to serve as police as may be necessary for the purose of preserving the peace and good order of the town, such persons to serve for one year unless removed by Councils, death or re-ignation.

SECTION 2-In case any vacancy shall occur in such office the Council shall appoint for the unexpired time.

SECTION 3-That for every neglect or refusal of the Street Commissioner, Poice, High Constable or any other officer of the Borough to perform the duties by the Borough ordinances or the aws of the Commonwealth, he or they shall forfeit and pay the sum of Ten Dollars for each and every offense, to be recovered as debts of like amount are now by law recoverable.

CROSSINGS PROTECTED.

Section 1-That any person or persons who shall lead, ride or drive any horse, mule or other beast, or drive any kind of vehicle on or across any of the pavements or side-walks within the lim-

pavements or side-wates within the linits of the Borough, except when passing to and from their own premises, shall pay a fine not exceeding Five Dollars for each and every offense.

Section 2—That any person or persons who shall stop any horse, mule or vehicle at or upon the crossing of any street or alley, or shall tie or fasten any horse, mule or other heast in such a plan.


