

FARM NOTES.

ONE of the simplest methods of making shingles fire proof is in the use of whitewash. Wood can be rendered practically fire proof by first drying it thoroughly and then coating it with common whitewash. The coat of white shells off, but still it is a difficult matter to burn wood that has been coated with whiting or even limewash. A mixture of borax and sulphate of magnesia is also recommended. To prepare this, use three pounds of borax and 21 pounds of sulphate of magnesia, with 20 pounds of water. The action of the mixture depends on the formation of a borate of magnesia insoluble in water, hot or cold, which surrounds and impregnates the fibres of the wood, and thus renders the development of the combustible gases and the spread of flames very difficult. A mixture of sullime or gypsum is also applied. The action of this mixture depends on an incrustation of fibers which prevents the spreading of fire, and on the other hand, extinguishes flames by the volatilization of the salt of ammonium at a high temperature. Take one pound of iquid ammonia and two pounds of sulphate lime. A single coat of this concentrated solution is not incombustible, but it is not easy to light, and ceases to burn when the action of foreign imflammable substances comes to an end.

SIR J. B. WORKING UP THE FARM,-Of course the farmer must make the most of the materials already in hand, and many a one is so situated that he can make no radical change in the general ine of farm management; but this does not imply that he must accommodate himself utterly and absolutely to things just as they are; making no effort for change and feeling no ambition for improvement, and more than that he should feel under the necessity of making his bread out of unground wheat, because that was the shape in which he originally got it. To make the most of his present material will often require that some new one be in troduced; some new modification or combination formed. The farm is stocked with animals of different kinds; to make the best use of these materials does not require that they be discarded and the farm restocked with thorough-breds. No such course is advisable or to be recommended to the general farmer. On the contrary these, for most people, should be maintained on the farm as a basis, and the most or best made out of them by the purchase of thoroughbred sires merely to cross on this stock to improve its character, and the whole stock gradually bred up, by the use of successive sires, to the point where the practical, useful qualities are highly developed. This will involve no very considerable change in general farm management at any one time, or any great outlay of money, or any considerable indebtedness over which the farmer will have to worry, but in a short time the farm will be by imperceptible stages worked on to a better basis. This is making the best of the materials already in hand, and the farmer is certainly very

FOR plants grown in pots, says the Floral Cabinet, guano should be mixed with water at the rate of one ounce to six quarts of water. But we should not advise its general application until toward spring, when the plants are in full growth and the soil somewhat ex hausted. FRUIT orchards should receive a generous top dressing at least once in every two years. Moderate applications of lime and generous ones of wood ashes are always profitable, and phosphates are useful if bnried beneath the surface; also Peruvian guano, if slightly covered, late in the fall, so as to become thoroughly divided by winter rains. Coarse organic manure should not be used in contact with the roots of young trees, but chip-dust, fish, flesh and the bones of dead animals, horn piths and hoofs, hair and old plaster, and all like articles, are good for growing trees. Pear trees that have not borne fruit for twenty years have been brought into full bearing by yarding two shoats beneath the trees in August and September, in an inclosure a rod square, having their beds close to the body of the tree. 
