HOUSEHOLD.

MISS NIGHTINGALE gives the following advice: There is reason to believe that not a few of the apparently unaccountable cases of scrofula among children proceeds from the habit of sleeping with the head under the bed clothes, and so inhaling air already breathed, which is further contaminated

by exhalations from the skin. Patients are sometimes given to a similar habit; and it often happens that the bed clothes are so disposed that the patient must necessarily breathe air more or less contaminated by exhalations from the skin. A good nurse will be careful to attend to this. It is an important part, so to speak, of ventilation. It may be worth while to remark that when there is any danger of bed sores a blanket should never be placed under the patient. It retains dampness and acts like a poultice. Never use anything but light woolen blankets as bed covering for the sick. The heavy, impervious cotton counterpane is bad, for the very reason that it keeps the emanations from the sick person, while the blanket allows them to pass through Weak patients are invariably distressed by a great weight of bed clothes, which often prevents their getting any sound s'eep whatever.

SAUSAGE OMELET.-Six eggs, one cup milk, one small teaspoonful cornstarch, one cup cold cooked sausage, chopped very fine. Beat the whites each is as light as it can be made. Stir together until they are tolerably well mingled, add the milk in which the cornstarch has been dissolved, and pour the whole into a omelet pan, containing a tablespoonful of sweet lard, boiling hot. It must not have been allowed to brown. Tip the pan from side to side that the mixture may not burn, and with a knife loosen the edges when they show signs of sticking. When it begins to grow firm in the middle, sprinkle over it the chopped sausage, cook a moment longer, double one-half of the omelet on the other with the knife, and slip from the pan to a hot dish. Serve at once.

STEAM PUDDING .- Take one egg, one-halt cup of sugar, one tablespoonful of melted butter or meat fryings, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, and a pinch of salt, and stir well together, then add one cup of cold water, and one-half cup of dried fruit or raisins, and thicken some stiffer than cake. 
