#### FARM NOTES.

POTASH AND BONE FOR PEACH TREES,-The most successful peachgrowers in the Middle States are those who use potash liberally as a fertilizer. In his late report on peach orchards to the New Jersey Experiment Station Mr. J. M. White remarks that the healthiest and longest lived orchards in that State "are those which have been fertilized with potash and phosphoric acid. Among other orchards he describes that of J. S. Quinba, of Chester, who has 4000 trees in bearing, six to ten years old. He applies 500 pounds of bone to the acre, and as much ashes as he can secure. The fruit is abundant and of good quality.

is used on a healthy one until thorough. ly cleansed. S. H. Wartman cultivates his 7000 bearing trees twice in a season. The past season he had 8600 baskets of peaches. Dr. H. Race, of Pittstown gathered 5100 baskets of peaches from 3000 trees. He used superphosahate and potash. J. L. Nixon, of Quakertown, sold 9000 baskets from his 12,000 trees the past season for \$9045; he cultivates well and applies barn mannre and wood ashes." Peach growers in this State who applied wood ashes liberally to their orchards have succeeded in raising good crops of

fruit when the orchards of their neigh-

bors who used no ashee were barren.

THE depth of drains and their distance apart should be regulated by reference to the thickness and order of the substrata, no less than by the character or texture of the supersoil. If the upper bed is retentive, and of such depth that the drains cannot be cut completely through it, the best system to adopt will be shallow drains at close intervals; and on the contrary, a pervious material should have deeper drains at wider intervals. If a comparatively thin bed of clay rests upon a porous substratum, the drains should be cut into the latter or through it according to its depth; and they must not be too far apart,

WHEN lice get into the poultry house disease follows. The hen will not lay and the chicks will gradually droop and die. The Poultry Keeper (Parkersburg, hot whitewash, sprinkling it freely on the walls and floor with a watering pot, first adding a teaspoonful of carbolic acld to each bucket of whitewash. Repeat weekly until the lice leave. Put sect powder in every crack and crevice-Thoroughly clean out the house, spade up the yards and see that the fowls have a dust bath. Sprinkle insect powder in the feathers of the fowls if necessary,

Good oats, peas and wheat are a better feed for fowls during moulting than corn as they contain more of the feathers. Again oats are a splendid food for keeping up the animal vigor.




