

FARM NOTES.

AN ENGLISH paper, in commenting upon the subject, remarks that the Cheshire dairy farmer, by free use of bone manure laid on the grass lands, makes his farm which at one time, before the application of bone manure, fed only twenty head of cows, now feed forty. In Cheshire two-thirds or more generally three-fourths, of a dairy farm are kept in perfect pasture, the remainder in tillage. Its dairy farmers are commonly bound to lay the whole of their manure not on the arable, but on the grass land, purchasing what may be necessary for the arable. The chief improvement besides drainage consists in the application of bone manure. In the milk of each cow, in its urine, in its manure, in the bones of each calf reared and sold off, a farm parts with as much earth phosphate of lime as is contained in half a hundred weight of bone dust. Hence the advantage of returning this mineral manure by boning grass lands. The quantity of bones now commonly given in Cheshire to an imperial acre of grass land is 1,200 to 1,500 weight. This dressing on pasture land will last seven or eight years, and on mowed land about half that period.

BUTTERMILK.—In warm summer weather many persons feel an irresistible craving for something sour, and often gratifying this desire by a free indulgence in pickles or vegetables made acid with vinegar. This demand for acid indicates a deficiency in the acid secretions in the stomach, and the demand for an artificial one is a natural one, but vinegar is not the best substitute. Lactic acid is one of the chief agents that give acidity to the gastric juice of the stomach in health. This is the acid of sour milk, and therefore one of the best summer diet drinks that we can use is buttermilk. It satisfies the craving for acids by giving the stomach a natural supply, and at the same time furnishing in its cheesy matter a good supply of wholesome nutrition. A man will endure fatigue in hot weather better on buttermilk than any drink he can use.

We all know what a large consumer of food the cow is. But it would seem to be expected by some that she can live and produce on comparatively nothing. On the contrary she must first be supplied with nutriment. Her milk and its products are simply the conversion of the surplus food that she does not need to supply the waste of the system, into these products.

IF YOUR horses are thin skinned and very much annoyed with flies when working or driving, steep up a handful of the wild wormwood or bitter weed, wet a cloth in it and just moisten the hair especially on ears, neck and legs, before taking them out of stable; or a few walnut leaves will have a similar effect. It will make the animal more comfortable and much more pleasant to drive.

AS SOON as the early crop of potatoes has been harvested you may plant sunflowers. Put the seeds in twelve inches apart each way, and when they are a foot high earth them up, and they will need no further care. If you keep bees the blossoms will be very valuable, while the seeds are excellent for poultry, and are in demand for making toilet soap.

IF PROPERLY constructed the hand wheel-hoe is, the Massachusetts Plowman thinks, one of the most important implements for a small farm. In garden or field more ground can be gone over with it in one hour than in six with a common hoe, and the work can be done much better if the weeds are small, as they always should be.

IT IS common to cut grain as low down as possible. Sometimes this is necessary to gather it all, when felled by rains, but otherwise there is no advantage in low cutting. A long stubble is often an efficient protection for young clover in winter. It holds the snow, which would otherwise blow away.

A CORRESPONDENT had success in destroying the rosebug, which is so destructive to the grapevine, by sprinkling the upper and lower sides of the leaves, when the dew was on, with ar-sacked lime, dusting it on by hand.

IT IS never safe to plow among trees when in full foliage, unless it is done with the purpose of root-plowing to induce fruitfulness. In spring or fall, when trees are bare, if roots are cut or torn by plowing the injury is very quickly repaired, with usually an increase in vigor.

IT IS worth while for farmers who use Paris green to know that the best antidote to the poison is iron rust. There are preparations of iron in liquid form which should be kept in farmers' houses wherever this popular insect poison is used. Of course the poison should be got from the stomach by emetics wherever possible.

ALL the work that can be done now in the shape of plowing is so much saved later on. After the season opens there are usually so many things to do at the same time that often many valuable crops are not seeded in till late.

PARENTS, cowboys and other rosters that are stored in the ground in mounds should be taken up and placed in a cool place in the cellar. If the soil be moist and the ground become warm they are liable to grow, which injures them.

The cattle of the Indian Territory and Texas are said to be ready for the trial, and it is estimated that the Spring drive will reach 300,000 head. The drive will not be as it had been heretofore, through Western Kansas, but will be along the National Trail, just over the State line in Colorado.

The suffering and loss of cattle to the Southwest last Winter tend to revolutionize the cattle business, says a Kansas rancher, and further that public sentiment is against large herds, and as the country is rapidly settling up, the herds must be made smaller and receive better care.
