TOO MANY LAWYERS

In other countries there is not that unlimited reliance on the legal profession for law makers that obtains in the United States. We suppose, on a rough guess, four-fifths of the members of congress are lawyers, good, bad and indifferent. They make the laws, construe them, and execute them. It would be very strange indeed if they were not made with an eye to the advantage of the guild.

In the British parliament it is not the lawyers that are in the majority, and mold its action, but the landed and commercial interest, with a strong mixture of younger sons trained to a career in politics. The strongest illustration of the fact lawyers are not a necessity in legislation and their overwhelming supremacy undesirable, is found in the German reichstag. It is composed of 398 members, and of that number—just think of it—only ten are lawyers. The reichstag is at present composed of 138 members of the landed interest, 97 public officials, 77 merchants and manufacturers, 62 professional men, including 18 clergymen, 16 professors and teachers, 10 lawyers and 8 physicians. The absence of a controlling legal and technical influence probably accounts for the simplicity and directness of German law. As, on the other hand, a superabundance of lawyers is responsible for the queer twists, turns and contrivances of American law.

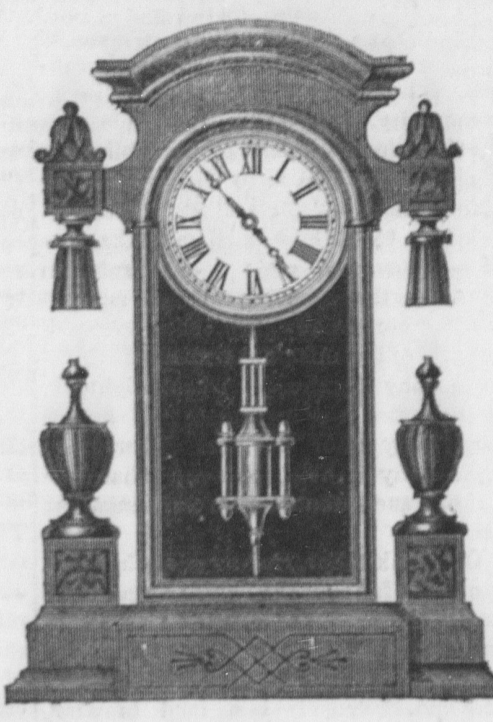

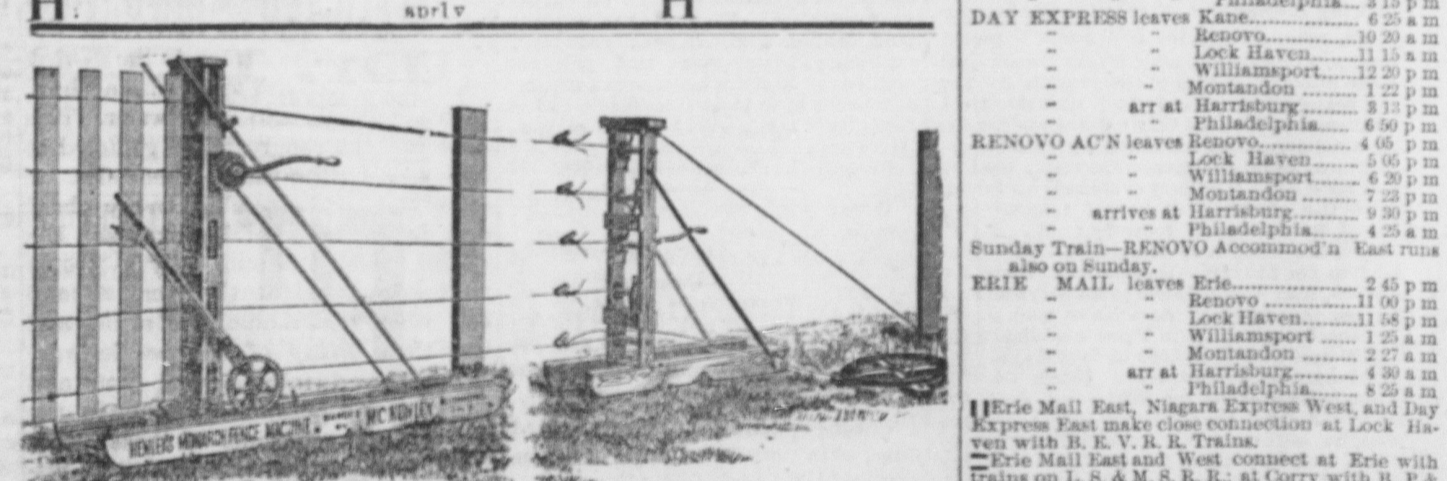
