Auditor General Norr's statement of the revenues of the commonwealth says the Patriot, is anything but satisfactory. He estimates a loss in the receipts to the amount of \$1,291,000, and an increase in the expenditures aggregating \$785,000. This makes a difference in the balance amounting to \$2,076,000.






