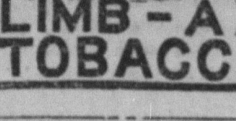

KILLED IN THE RING.

Billy Dempsey Struck Down by 'Swipes,' The Newboy.

Brooklyn, Jan. 23.—Tom White, better known as "Swipes, the Newboy," and Billy Dempsey, at one time employed by the New York Herald, met in the ring at Fort Hamilton Saturday night, and at the close of the first round Dempsey was struck in the jaw and fell to the ground senseless.

When the fight began both men advanced smiling and made a few passes at each other. Dempsey received a few light blows in the body and recoiled. As he was falling Swipes landed a terrific blow on his jaw and the fell head over heels.

The spectators at first thought that the affair was a fizzle and began to comment on the result, but some one remarked that it was a serious case.

Dempsey did not recover consciousness and then they became alarmed. Restoratives were used, but they were of no use. In an hour afterward he was dead.

The coroner was at once notified and will hold an inquest to-day. He said his assistant, Dr. Shepard, had examined the remains of the dead pugilist, but in his opinion death had resulted from heart disease.

Tom White gave himself up last night and was locked up. He did not seem to be alarmed at his position, but took matters very coolly. He appeared greatly pleased, however, when Chief Campbell told him that the cause of his death was expressed in an opinion that Dempsey's death was due to some organic trouble.

Over Her Loss. NORRISTOWN, Pa., Jan. 21.—Mrs. Mary Ann Brown, who was stricken by Mrs. Hendricks out of many thousands of dollars, is very ill. She is unable to state the precise amount she lost.
