El Orolo, a daily newspaper has been suppressed for publishing bogus news of a proposed embargo on American newspapers by the Postoffice Department.

W. D. Dunson, a well-known diver of Boston, has been seen exploring the ocean bottom for chests of foreign gold supposed to have sunk centuries ago in some foreign war vessels.

They report having found and raised an immense anchor of antique style and foreign pattern, having a shank about fifteen feet long and a ring twenty-nine inches in diameter.

They also raised two iron cannons of antique style and found a part of a vessel's bottom, with pig iron ballast, all of which have recently been washed out of the sand after being covered, perhaps, for centuries.

The guns are thickly covered with shells and deposit and are to be placed on exhibition.

A Conditional Pardon. TOPEKA, Kan., May 26.—A pardon has been issued by Gov. Martin to Charles B. Rotrock, of Ottawa county, who killed his wife a number of years ago while under the influence of liquor.

BALTIMORE, May 25.—There is no truth in the report sent out from here that a meeting of Catholic prelates is to be held in Baltimore this week or at any future time to consider the labor question, and looking to the establishment of workingmen's guilds.

HANNIBAL, Mo., May 25.—Lincolna Cook has been sentenced to twenty-five years in the Penitentiary for killing his brother-in-law, Barber Jackson, and seriously wounding his own wife.

SPRINGFIELD, Mass., May 25.—The works of the Hampshire Paint and Chemical Company were destroyed by fire early yesterday. Loss on machinery, building and stock, \$50,000.

CHICAGO, May 25.—Zachariah Squires, dealer in hardware at No. 78 Lake street, has assigned. Liabilities, \$200,000; assets about the same.

HORRORS OF A CUBAN PRISON.

HAYANA, Cuba, May 25.—Revelations as to the treatment of prisoners now confined in the Cuban Fort his caused considerable talk and is being noticed by the press. The disclosures shows the most cruel and inhuman practice on the prisoners. Seventy prisoners are under arrest and four of them have made sworn statements.

Antonio Molerio was arrested on the Morales estate by Tomonto Saluz. He was beaten and for forty hours had no food. Saluz told him that if he would swear that the Mayor and three Aldermen of Matanzas were implicated in the kidnapping of Senor Alentado he would set him free.

Florencio Diaz Betancourt was arrested by Saluz. He was beaten till he fainted. When he recovered consciousness his fingers, broken and crushed, were in a vise. He cried like a child.

These exposures have aroused the people. Protests have been sent to Madrid. The press calls on Capt. Gen. Marina to take steps in the matter at once.
