To make a very good article of mustard take one beaten egg, two teaspoonfu's sugar, one teaspoonful corn starch and two teaspoonfuls mustard. Mix smooth and pour into one teacupful boiling vinegar.

DWARF pears should be planted on a spot that has a moist subsoil, either natural or made so by subspiling or mixing some material with the soil that will give out moisture in dry weather. Trees already planted on a dry, gravelly subsoil, should have a circle dug out two feet deep and two or three feet from the tree. This should be filled up with well enriched soil. If the dwarf pear does not grow freely it is a sign that something is wrong. It should be severely pruned, so as to aid in producing a vigorous growth.

MAKE a mixture hydraulic cement and skim-milk for painting farm buildings and fences by putting the cement in a bucket and sweet skim milk stirred in until the mixture is of the consistency of cream. This is not guess work, but the teaching of practice and experience.
