Forcay was carried to the home of Harry Wagner, and a doctor sent for. An examination revealed the fact that the left lung was cut about half off. Everytime the wounded man drew a breath the wind could be felt issuing from the gash in his side.

Both are young men and their reputations in the past have not been bad, and were aged about 21 years, and unmarried, and were never known to be rough, boisterous or abusive.
