BRANDT PRESERS.

Prepare the peachet and the syrup as in the foregoing resipe, using the same proportions, and before filling the jars add a pint of best brandy, slightly warmed.

PEACHES A LA SUEDOISE.

Cut a dozen*fine peaches in halves, remove the stones and boil the peaches in white sugar syrup; drain on a sieve and remove the skins. Cut a sandwich loaf of bread in two lengthwise, trim off all crust from one-half of it and fry this in hot butter; drain and cool, put it on a flat dish, arrange the peaches on top of it, reduce the syrup a little and pour it over the peaches. The top layer should be covered with whipped


