The northern portion of the desert is paved with the most wonderful peb-bles in the world—in many parts so exquisitely laid as to defy successful imitation by the most skilled worker in masonic flooring. They are made of porphyry, agate, carnelian, quartz, erystals, garnets, chrysolite and other

beautiful materials. They are packed together so that the surface composed of them is like a floor, and they look as if pre-sed into it with a roller. As a rule, they are of nearly uniform size, and each one is polished brilliantly, as if oiled and rubbed. Most of them are perfect spheres, and the reflection from them of the sun's rays is gorgeous beyond description. Each convex surface gives back a ray of light, and the ground for miles seems as if literally paved with gems. 
Pandora's Box.
