About What You Must Spend to Visit Chicago.

Many of our readers have doubtless been thinking about going to Chicago to see the World's Fair and the most natural question that arises first in your minds is "how much will it cost?"

In answer to this we take the following article from the Easton Sentinel: Presuming the questioner to be intent only upon seeing the exhibition, getting a maximum of return for a minimum outlay, not over fastidious as to sleeping accommodations, except as to cleanliness, and not epicurean as to meals, the answer is \$25.50 for a ten days' visit, to which must be added railroad fare. His bill of expense will be as follows:

The following is on ten days basis: Sleeping accommodations at \$1.25, Admission to the grounds at 50c, Meals, breakfast twenty-five cents, midday in the grounds seventy-five cents, tea twenty-five cents, \$1.25.

One entrance to each of twenty-one side shows on Midway Plaisance at twenty-five cents. One ride on the elevated road 10, One ride on the electric boat 10, One ride on the sliding railroad 10, One ride on the ice railroad 10, Use of lavatory once each day for ten cents 1.00, Use of camp stool each day at ten cents 1.00.

GOV. CURTIN HONORED.

Tendered a Reception by the House of Representatives.

On Friday 21st, Ex-Governor Curtin was tendered an impromptu reception by the house of representatives at Harrisburg, says the Patriot. The venerable "war governor" came to the city on an early morning train to appear before the appropriations committee to urge the passage of a bill making an appropriation to a Philadelphia charitable institution, and towards the close of the morning session he wandered in on the floor of the house. Representative Fow was the first to recognize the distinguished spectator and escorted him to a front seat on the minority side of the hall.

Ex-Speaker Boyer, of Philadelphia, walked over to where the old gentleman was sitting intently watching the proceedings and shook hands with him. Returning to his seat Mr. Boyer offered the following resolution: That the house of representatives noticing the presence on its floor of the great war governor of Pennsylvania, Andrew G. Curtin, extends to him its patriotic greeting with a cordial expression of esteem and a hope that he may long live in health and prosperity among the people he so ably and heroically represented and defended in the crisis of the great Republic. The resolution was unanimously adopted by a rising vote. The whilom governor responded by rising in his seat and bowing politely to the speaker and those who sat near him, which called forth vigorous applause. A recess of ten minutes was taken at the suggestion of Mr. Crawford, to give the members and officers of the house an opportunity to pay their respects to the honored guest. Among those who shook the hand of the venerable statesman were the veterans, Cessna and Lawrence, who were associated with him in public life when he was at the zenith of his fame. The three old men laughed and chatted of old times. Governor Curtin is now in his eighty-third year, Mr. Lawrence is seventy-four and Mr. Cessna is seventy-two. The incident of his reception was unprecedented in the annals of the house.



A poorly fed fish will have few or no spots, a drab belly and dull yellow sides. A very old trout will have the same hue; in addition he will be lean and large headed. Young, healthy, fast growing trout may be detected by their silvery sides, white belly and numerous and highly colored spots. It is asserted that the color of a trout's back depends upon the color of the bottom of the river or stream in which he lives. Of them all, however, trout which have access to salt water possess the most dazzling silver tints, owing to the variety and abundance of food at their command.—Ex.
