The term of the present "public printer expired on the 13th instant. If there are any sinecures attached to the Washington Navy Yard, which is in reality no longer a Navy Yard, but a gun shop, they have got to go. Secretary Herbert has requested the commandent to report at once whether any position or positions now filled can be dispensed with, and whether any person now employed is incompetent or inefficient from any cause whatever. A similar request will probably be made of the commandants at all the government navy yards. There is to be a big discharge at the end of the present fiscal year from the General Land Office, owing to the cut made in the appropriation by Congress. Sixty-eight clerks in the classified service and thirty-nine special agents will sever their connection with Uncle Sam's business on the 33th of June, unless they can before that time get transferred to some other branch of the service. In order to avoid the pressure by the friends of the clerks in that bureau it has been decided that the dismissals shall be made solely on the records of the clerks. Secretary Herbert has deprived the Nicaragua Canal Co. of its chief engineer by ordering Civil Engineer Menocal, who has been working for the Canal Co., for about four years, to return to duty.
