

SEASHORE EXCURSIONS.

To Burn the School Books.

At a recent meeting of the state board of health a resolution was adopted at the sense of the boards that all the boards of education should require destruction by fire of all school books used in families when contagious or infectious diseases exist. The subject of cholera was discussed and a system has been adopted for prompt action in case of an outbreak of the disease on emigrant trains en route. It contemplates the most prompt and rigid measures to prevent the spread of the disease. Circulars of instructions are issued to the local boards of health, in which are given methods for repressing or preventing the epidemic.
