DR. SCHAFF DEAD.

A Leader Among Theologians Enters Into Final Rest.

Rev. Dr. Philip Schaff, regarded by many as the greatest living authority on exegesis and church history, died Friday morning at his home in New York. Paralysis was the immediate cause of his death. Dr. Schaff took his degree of B. D., and passed an examination for a professorship, in Berlin, 1841, after which he traveled through Europe as tutor to the son of a Prussian nobleman. In 1844 removed to America, accepting a professorship in the theological seminary of the German Reformed church of the United States, at Mercersburg, Pa. He held this position from 1844 to 1863, when he removed to New York. His lectures on church history, delivered in theological seminaries at Andover, Hartford POWDER, and New York, gave him great prominence, and in 1870 he was made professor of sacred literature at Union Theological seminary, New York. He was one of the founders and the first secretary of the American branch of ATLAS POWDER.-The very best the Evangelical alliance. When the American Bible revision committee was organized in 1871, at the request of the British committee, Dr. Schaff was made its president. Dr. Schaff's title of D. D. was conferred on him by the University of Berlin in 1854. His other titles include a numerous list of honors paid him by learned bodies. In August, 1887, on the death of Dr. Roswell D. Hitchcock, Dr. Schaff was called to the head of the seminary's historical department as his successor.

Dr. Schaff some forty years ago visited in Penns valley, and in company with Rev. P. S. Fisher, of Boalsburg, was at the home of the editor of the REPORTER, at Aaronsburg. He preached in some of the Reformed churches in our valley.
