

ADJOINING COUNTIES.

Interesting Items Briefly Paragraphed for our Readers.

Attorney General Hensel will deliver an address before the Lancaster county teachers' institute which opens Monday at Lancaster.

Advises received at Tacoma state that 20 men were eaten alive by wolves at Shensi on October 14 and 15. Wild animals overrun that district.

Bailey, of the Barnum circus, says he was robbed this season of \$100,000 by a conspiracy of ticket sellers and door tenders.

Frank Eisele, of South Williamsport, committed suicide by hanging Saturday morning. No cause is assigned for the act.

At the next Court of Quarter Sessions an application will be made for the incorporation of Barnesboro, Cambria county into a borough.

Robert Lepler, of Wagner, Mifflin county, lost three children by death from diphtheria within a few days, the eldest sixteen and the youngest three years old.

The barn of Dr. George Stewart, at Orbisonia, was destroyed by fire, including three horses, the summer's crops and farming utensils. Loss, \$2,100; partly insured.

While playing foot ball Saturday afternoon, Casper Emerson, a boy of Williamsport, met with an accident which resulted in the breaking of his collar bone on the right side.

Last Saturday the glass works at Kensington were started up, giving employment to 900 men. The glass works at Jeannette are expected to blow in this week and 1,200 men will be made happy.

The longest reach of railway without a curve is that of the New Argentine Pacific railway from Buenos Ayres to the foot of the Andes. For 211 miles it is without a curve and has no cutting or embankment deeper than two or three feet.

John Hoy, of Conemaugh, recently received word from the Mexican minister that his cousin had died there leaving him a large coffee plantation. The letter also stated that a package had been left in care of the Mexican government that was not to be opened until delivered to John Hoy.

James Lowther, of Bellwood, one of Blair county's most prominent citizens, died at his home at 11.20 Monday. Deceased had been ill for a long time, therefore his death was not altogether unexpected. In connection with the Flynn brothers he carried on an extensive lumber business in Blair, Cambria and Clearfield counties.

J. B. Slocum, of Slavy's Mills, quarreled with his daughter Charlotte, aged thirty, because she had neglected to sew a button on his overcoat, and slapped her face. This indignity preyed so on Miss Slocum's mind that she went to her room and hanged herself. The Slocums are wealthy. The daughter was to have been married this week to a lumber operator.

New Outlet For The Coke Regions.

It is announced that during the present winter the Beech Creek Railroad, which has a terminus at the Patton Mines, near Carrollton, will begin the construction of a line that will extend from Carrollton to the Connelville coal region, and which will ultimately join in the Beech Creek people's securing a line to Johnstown. The new road will extend from the mines and follow the north branch of the Blacklick into Indiana county, thence into Westmoreland county and finally intersect at Connelville with the Pittsburgh and Youghiogheny Railroad.

Great Flood in Japan.

From China comes frightful news of loss of life and tremendous destitution by the floods in the southern and middle provinces of Japan. At Toyoe the water rose twenty feet and submerged all the houses in the town. At Mifunua the water attained a height of 30 feet, sweeping away many houses. It was still worse in the neighboring prefect of Ekayema, where at Kawabe the water rose 18 feet and broke down a great embankment, carrying away 250 houses. About 100 persons are unaccounted for.
