A DISGRACEFUL NOMINATION.

The Republicans of Crawford county have again nominated Representative Andrews for the State Senate. He was the nominated candidate of the party four years ago for the same office when he was Chairman of the Republican State committee, but his county, with fully two thousand Republican majority, defeated him by over a thousand. Two years ago he forced himself upon the Republican ticket as a candidate for Representative and was again defeated, but ousted his successful competitor and crawled into his seat on a naked technicality. It was not pretended that he had not been honestly defeated by the people, but a legal technicality was summoned to disfranchise a number of districts in his county, and he was thus given the place which the people had refused to award him. In the face of these two defeats he has again accomplished his own nomination for the State Senate, and unless self-respect has ceased to be cherished by the people of that county he will be defeated again.

It is doubtless believed by Mr. Andrews and his friends that this will be a great Republican year, and that anybody may be elected on that side where there is a party majority regardless of the respect he commands from the people. But while the Republicans seem reasonably certain to win doubtful and possibly even adverse districts next fall where they present good candidates, it is not at all certain that objectionable candidates can be elected even in the Republican districts.

The people of Pennsylvania repudiated Andrews and his methods four years ago, not only by defeating him for the Senate, but by defeating his special candidate for Governor, Mr. Delamater, and there is little disposition in that party at this time to encourage a revival of the Andrews political methods. It is not improbable, therefore, that however the Republicans may succeed generally throughout the State in November, candidates whose nominations are an affront to intelligent and honest voters may be defeated. Mr. Andrews certainly deserves to be defeated overwhelmingly, and unless the Republicans of Crawford county shall be false themselves they will not permit his election to the Senate.-Philadelphia

THE TARIFF FINISHED.

At last the senate has the tariff bill before it as finished by the finance committee and the bill is to pass early in June, perhaps sooner.

The house duties are restored; many of the changes are unimportant; the duty on rice is restored; the chemical schedule is reconstructed and the duties changed from ad valorem to specific; numerous changes are made in the woolen and cotton schedules; whisky is left untouched but a fight is proba-

All the Democratic senators have been brought to unite upon this bill except senator Hill, who opposes it upon the income tax feature. The Democrats can pass the bill without 3 cans Corn 36, how Hill's vote.

THE "Patriot" says: The political prophets still stick to it that under "Governor" Hastings the attorney general will be Lyman D. Gilbert, of Philadelphia; secretary of state, Col. James H. Lambert, of the Philadelphia Press, if he wants to be; Thomas J. Stewart adjutant general. Gen. Fr. Reeder can be induced to take the place assigned to Colonel Lambert if Lambert peremptorily declines.

THE Republicans having carried our county last fall by some 500 majority, makes them feel hopeful of carrying it again the coming fall. Well, we will see about that, later on. If the Democrats put a strong local ticket in the field, the opposition may as well hang their harp upon the willows. The affairs of our county have been so well managed by Democratic county commissioners that the people have no reason whatever to complain. The other Democratic county officials have proven obliging as well as competent and there is no dissatisfaction on their account. Now why should not our party, with good and true men on the ticket, be successful?


