SAYS THE Philad. Times: The Quay visit to McKinley is over, and the thousands of political expectants who have been started out of their wits by the announcement that Quay and McKinley meant to confer, can now settle down in tranquillity. The world did not take pause in its revolutions; the sun shines just as brightly as ever; the birds sing as sweetly; the flowers bloom as fragrantly and things altogether jog on in just the usual way as if Quay and McKinley had kept apart forever. The only probable fruit of the visit will be that while McKinley and Quay were not unfriendly before the Canton conference, they are likely to be more than friendly thereafter.

WITH the death of Hon. Wm. A. Wallace one of Pennsylvania's ablest and purest men has passed away. He was a Democratic leader in his day without a peer, and under his wise counsel the Democracy of the state was united and strong. He was respected by the opposition for his honesty and feared on account of his distinguishing qualities as a leader. Mr. Wallace, unfortunately, by jealous hands, was headed off in his successful leadership to the detriment of the Democracy. The Philadelphia Record contains these truthful words: "Over the grave of Senator Wallace his lifelong political opponents hasten to pay tribute with his lifelong friends to those many qualities which commanded the respect of his fellows and the confidence of the public. The Wallaces who take part in our politics are few and far between; it would be fortunate for the country if there were more of them."

We are glad to say, as the remains of this noble Pennsylvanian are lowered into their last resting place in the cemetery at Clearfield that the REPORTER was one of those who stood by him because of his manliness and purity, and it is also a pleasant remembrance to know, that in William A. Wallace we had an inestimable friend.

THE Harrisburg Patriot calls attention to the fact that this year the Democratic party is one hundred years old. It began business in 1796, and has outlived many opposing organizations. The Federal and Whig parties managed four times to carry the Presidential election, holding that office for sixteen years. The Republican party has seven times elected its President. The Democratic party has carried the country fourteen times in Presidential contests, and has made its lasting impress upon the character of the Federal Government as illustrated in the accepted interpretation of its constitutional powers. There will be no danger of the dissolution of the Democratic party as long as the Republic shall last; for it is founded upon the principles which underlie successful representative government.

THE indignation of the McKinleyites at their candidate being asked to declare himself on the gold and silver question may be hot, but it is not virtuous. It is all fuss and feathers. They know as well as other people what's the matter.

McKinley alone has been named as his State's favorite son, on a financial straddle. Morton, of New York is on a platform that men can bet on, and personally he is another of that sort. Reed of Maine is no firmer in his head than in his feet, which are planted on a rock-bottomed pledge for sound money. The platforms of Iowa, proposing Allison; of Pennsylvania, proposing Quay; and of Kentucky, proposing Bradley, look but one way and are designed to humbug nobody. On the Democratic side the Missouri platform, making Bland the candidate, is for free silver. Russell has been named in Massachusetts on a gold platform. But the Ohio platform is a straddle, rendered doubly doubtful by the fact that the Ohio candidate is a known straddler.

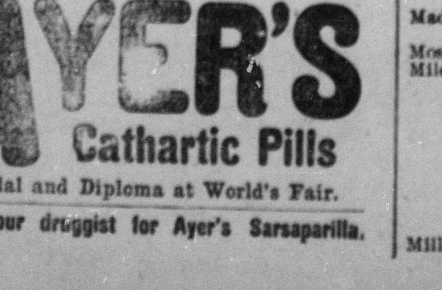
